ABSTRACT

Nursing Care of Sensory Perception Disorder Auditory Hallucinations in Schizophrenia Hebefrenic Clients at Menur Mental Hospital Surabaya.

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Sensory perception disorder: auditory hallucinations are a phenomenon that often occurs in people with hebefrenic schizophrenia in which the client believes that he heard a whisper. Auditory hallucinations if not handled properly will be bad for the client, family, other people or even the environtmen. Therefore, the authors conducted research on nursing care for clients with sensory hallucinations in hebefrenic schizophrenia with the aim of obtaining new information and as a reference material for the development of nursing knowledge so as to improve the quality of nursing care associated with the problem.

This study uses a case study method with a nursing care approach which includes assessment, nursing diagnosis, planning, implementation, and evaluation. The unit of analysis studied was two hebefrenic schizophrenic patients at the Surabaya Menur Mental Hospital with the main problem of sensory perception disorder: auditory hallucinations. Research data were collected using interviews with research subjects using medical records and general observations. Data collections instruments using the format of mental nursing care from the book of mental nursing processes (Keliat, B.A. et al). This research was conducted from January 13 to January 29, 2020.

Based on data analysis, the conclusions obtained from the client assessment stages 1 and 2 listen to whispers, often daydreaming. The nursing diagnosis obtained was sensory perception disorder: auditory hallucinations, palnning according to theory, namely building trusting relationships, reprimending techniques, talking with others, doing group activities, taking medication regularly. Implementation of nursing in accordance with th plan drawn up. The eveluation obtained is based on different responses form each client.

It is expected that health workers will be able to provide comprehensive nursing care so clients can control their auditory hallucinations independently.
